

HERITAGE HUB SOURCE LIST TRACING MILITARY ANCESTORS

This source list gives an introduction to the records available, most of which are held nationally rather than at local centres. The archives and reference books listed here are held at the Heritage Hub which also offers free internet access to enable you to research online. Do ask staff for assistance.

Please note that the Scottish Borders Archive and Local History Service is not responsible for the content of the websites and external links given here.

GENERAL WEBSITES

- **National Archives, Kew** - www.nationalarchives.gov.uk
Formerly the Public Records Office, National Archives is the major UK repository for military records from the British army, navy and air force, including colonial and dominion forces. This is your first point of information giving an overview on what is available, with digitised records on the Documents Online pages. The website also offers detailed guides to research.
- **National Archives of Scotland, Edinburgh** - www.nas.gov.uk
Includes an online record guide to military records. The main NAS record of individuals in the Scottish army before 1707 is the series of muster rolls. Post 1707, official military records are held by The National Archives at Kew.
- **National War Museum of Scotland** - www.nms.ac.uk/warmuseum
The Museum at Edinburgh Castle features uniforms, insignia and equipment, medals, decorations, weapons, paintings, ceramics and silverware, all of which throw light on Scotland's military history, from world-changing events to the everyday life of Scottish servicemen, with documents, photographs, diaries and official documents.
- **Imperial War Museum, London** - www.iwm.org.uk
Holds an extensive collection of private diaries, letters, papers and unpublished memoirs; also a series of biographical files on holders of the Victoria Cross and George Cross. Online guides on tracing ancestry in the Royal Navy, Army, Royal Flying Corps and Royal Air Force.
- **Military Service Records** - www.veterans-uk.info/
Provides information on accessing personnel service records. Records prior to the 1920's are held at the National Archives (see above) and are freely available for public access. For more recent records, strict rules are in place on releasing information only to proven next of kin, confirmed by birth certificate and death certificate. A fee will also be charged. Specific details for each service are given online.
- **Ancestry** - www.ancestry.co.uk and www.findmypast.com
Two commercial subscription/pay-as-you-view-sites that host a substantial collection of military databases ranging from First World War records to listings of Scottish soldiers in colonial America.
- **Military Genealogy** – www.military-genealogy.com
A commercial site launched by the Naval and Military Press, with a number of databases, including the Men of the Battle of Waterloo 1815, and the National Roll of the Great War, which, unlike many other listings, contains details of men and some women who survived the conflict.

A starting point for identifying medals.
- **London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes** – www.gazettes-online.co.uk
The official newspaper for the United Kingdom, covering 350 years of history, with information on official honours and awards.

The first national memorial dedicated to members of the armed forces killed on duty since World War Two was recently unveiled. The website offers a search facility with information up to 31 December 2006,

POSTCARDS

- The Heritage Hub holds an extensive indexed postcard collection which includes photographs of war memorials in Border towns and villages.

LOCAL NEWSPAPERS

- The Heritage Hub holds on microfilm 25 titles of local newspapers. These range from a complete run of the "Southern Reporter" first published in 1855 to papers which have long past into history such as the "Kelso Mail", "Teviotdale Record" and "St. Ronan's Standard".
- Conflicts such as the Crimean War and Boer War feature and columns during the First World War are particularly poignant with pages filled with profiles and often photographs of casualties.
- As few newspapers are indexed, be prepared for a protracted search to find relevant information unless you have a clear idea of the date i.e. month and year.
